Crow Wing County Inspection Season

- CWC watercraft inspectors started inspecting watercrafts as scheduled on May 14th "Fishing Opener" weekend.
- Last inspection day was September 24th



2023 Watercraft Inspectors: Significant Changes

- New inspectors received \$17 per hour.
- Experienced inspectors received \$18 per hour.
- Lead Inspector received \$19 per hour.

2023 Watercraft Inspection Challenges

- Rising gas costs caused concerns with scheduling them closer to home.
- · Pay increases.
- Concerns with Lake Service Providers not following rules.
- Bathrooms at landings.
- More eye catching, simpler handouts.

2023 CWC AIS Prevention Planning Process



September 2022: State of Minnesota allocated \$462,052 to CWC for local AIS prevention aid funds



\$505,283 allocated for watercraft inspections

This allocated amount includes hiring costs, salaries for inspections, trainings, supplies for inspectors, and a portion of Environmental Services Coordinators salary.



2022 Vs **2023** Watercraft Inspections

The 2023 plan allocated ${\bf 16,155}$ inspection hours, an increase from 2022.

Starry Search Program

- 2023 Funds Allocated: \$10,200
- 2023 Funds Distributed: \$3,000
- 6 lake associations participated in our Starry Search program and were incentivized by sampling lakes for AIS with public access.

2023 CWC EWM Treatment Grant

- Milfoil treatment: \$32,500
 - \$3,500 per-lake for treatment and surveying of EWM on 9 eligible lakes.
 - The County approved \$500 towards a EWM survey to be conducted on Lake Ossawinamakee & Emily
 - The County distributed \$28,500

AIS Outreach and Education Activities

- Sent Lake Associations bi-weekly updates.
- Local High School Outreach
- Highlighted AIS prevention and protection at the CWC Fair.
- Pelican Lakes Association Newsletter
- Inspector provided "Protect our Lakes!" towels at landings

2023 CWC AIS Early Prevention

- Early AIS Detection: \$2,900
- Zebra mussel veliger and Spiny water-flea testing were completed in July and August.
- All 20 lakes tested were free of zebra mussels and spiny water-flea.



2023 AIS Risk Model

AIS Risk determines all allocated hours:

<u>High-risk landings (22 landings):</u>

Staffed 9am to 6pm, Friday to Sunday, beginning Fishing Opener and ending Labor Day weekend.

Moderate-risk landings (6 landings):

Staffed 9am to 6pm, Saturday and Sunday, beginning Fishing Opener and ending Labor Day weekend.

Low-risk landings (11 landings):

Staffed 9am to 6pm, Saturday and Sunday, beginning Memorial Weekend and ending Labor Day weekend.


Very low-risk landings (4 landings):

Staffed 9am to 6pm, on the three holiday weekends, Memorial, July $4^{\rm th}$, and Labor Day.


- 50,850 watercraft inspections.



 - Mission Lake = lowest number of hours: 18 (0.11%)




- **42,274** watercraft inspections *excluding expanded coverage.*





 - White Sand = Lowest Survey Count: 2 (0.72%)






2023 Watercraft Inspection Data

- In 2023, Crow Wing County Performed:
 - An average of 2.66 surveys/hour across all lakes.
 - 17 lakes were above average
 - 25 lakes were below average
- From 2020 to 2023, Crow Wing County Performed
 - An average of ${f 2.64}$ surveys/hour
 - 22 lakes were above average
 - 20 lakes were below average
- 2023 was an ABOVE average year!




- In 2023:
 - Nisswa Lake = highest average surveys/hour: **7.78**
 - Upper & Lower Mission = lowest average surveys per hour: 0.61
 - 16 lakes were below their 4-year average
 - 25 lakes were above their 4-year average


2023 Watercraft Inspection Data

- most frequent boat type = Fishing Boat:
 - 25,381 (50.53%) Surveyed
- least frequent boat type = Cabin Cruiser
 - 82 (0.16%) surveyed




- AIS were most frequently detected:
 - On the watercraft (**53.85**%) when entering
 - On the trailer (61.11%) when exiting

2023 Watercraft Inspection Data

- Aquatic Plants were the most frequently found AIS
 - 78% of species entering and 93% of species exiting
- Snail were the least frequently found AIS:
 - 0.13% of species entering and 0% of species exiting
- · Zebra Mussels represented:
 - 4% of species entering and 3% of species exiting



- · Zebra mussels
 - 96.47% of boats did not have ZM present when entering
 - 96.86% of boats did not have ZM when exiting
 - 3.53% of boats had ZM detected when entering
 - 3.14% of boats had ZM detected when exiting

2023 Watercraft Inspection Data

- In 2023:
 - 40,413 (80.45%) of boaters were from MN
 - Boaters from 45 States, including MN, visited a Crow Wing County lake



December - 30-day public comment period on proposed CWC AIS 2024 plan.

January - County Board acts on the 2024 AIS plan.

February – Begin hiring process for 2024 seasonal watercraft inspectors.
